MPS-Quality terms and definitions

Acceptable supplier the supplier (of plant material) positively assessed by the

participant in terms of delivery performance (price, quality and delivery time), which is registered as such by the participant.

Soil supply Materials which are added to top up the cultivation layer. Soil

supply is used in nurseries where the soil is removed with the

root balls.

Nonconformity something that fails to comply with a standard, specification

or agreement.

PCN-free certificate Potato cyst nematode-free declaration.

Soil improvement materials Materials which are added to improve the cultivation layer.

Soil improvement materials are used in situations when the soil components such as organic matter, nutrients and/or mineral elements are not present in the optimum quantities in

the soil.

Tree nursery products or perennials Woody crops supplied in their entirety or as top-graft cuttings,

seeds, unrooted cuttings or buds ('bud-eyes'), material from tissue culture, as well as perennials and aquatic plants, all in a

living condition.

Certificate The document, issued by the certification body, that indicates

that there is a legitimate expectation that the company named on the certificate acts in accordance with the requirements set

out in the MPS-certification criteria.

Certificate holder Company that has been certified by the certification body on

the basis of (part of) the certification scheme, that has obtained the corresponding certificate and is liable to fulfil all obligations arising from the certification scheme (or the

appropriate elements of that scheme).

Certification Body (CB): Organisation licensed by MPS to monitor compliance with the

requirements of the certification scheme and entitled to award

certificates.

Central Reporting Point for

Complaints

the central reporting point for complaints set up by MPS. Under certain conditions, the grower's contacts can register a complaint with MPS. MPS will make these conditions known.

Corrective measure a measure to remove the source of a detected nonconformity

or other undesirable situation.

Document Recorded information – in any form (e.g. on paper or

electronic) - relevant for the quality care system of your

company.

Electronic Delivery Note (EAB) a document intended for electronic dispatch in accordance

with the conditions specified by the auction in question.

ENA European Nurserystock Association

Conditioned storage space A clean area in which the temperature can be controlled.

Products can be stored here.

HBN Trade conditions Tree Nursery Netherlands (HBN)

Purchasing the purchase of organic parental material and cultivation

material.

Complaint an expression of dissatisfaction with a product and/or service

falling within agreed parameters.

Complaints analysis The received complaints are evaluated periodically. Based on

the conclusions drawn, working methods and operating processes are modified in order to avoid further complaints.

Customer satisfaction survey

An analysis that provides insight into the level of satisfaction

of customers regarding the supplied products and services. The aim of a customer satisfaction survey is to tailor the product and the service better to the wishes of the customers

and business contacts.

Critical control point A point or step in the process that is of great importance for

maintaining product quality. Through management and control, this risk can be limited to an acceptable level.

Critical cultivation material those products that have a major influence on the quality

and/or quality of the end product.

Quality control point critical control point at which a check is carried out because

any subsequent errors in the process will be irreparable.

Quality manual a document that describes how the operating processes

should proceed, who is responsible for them, how audits are

carried out and who is responsible for the audits.

Supplier company supplying parental material, cultivation material or

other required materials.

Naktuinbouw Dutch Inspection Service for Horticulture

Personnel plan a document that describes the tasks and responsibilities of

staff members, meeting structures and performance appraisal

interviews.

Product specifications specified requirements that the product must fulfil, as agreed

with the client or the auction. VBN specifications are displayed

at www.vbn.nl.

QI Quality Index: shows the reliability of the photo, inspection

and grading characteristics of the products supplied by a grower on the clock front. Suppliers can distinguish

themselves on reliability.

RAG Quality mark for soil supply and soil-improving materials.

Contact: people people and/or organisations with whom you maintain

business relations and/or share business interests.

RHP Quality mark for raw materials, potting soils and substrates.

Scope The description of the activities of a company that is certified

against the MPS-SQ certification scheme.

Specification specifications are understood as the conditions of delivery

agreed upon with the client. The VBN product specifications

(see www.vbn.nl) apply to supplies to auctions.

Test phase the period in the vase/shelf life test during which the products

are tested in a simulation of the conditions in the subsequent

links of the chain.

Traceability the possibility to trace a product back to its source with

certainty.

Parental material Plants and plant parts that are intended to be used for the

cultivation of flower nursery products, or for propagation or

used for that purpose.

Responsibility the obligation the account for the results of his/her actions.

Improvement plan a document that describes how the grower works towards

improving his performance.

Expected value the expected average vase/shelf life after VBN (www.VBN.nl)
